Did you know Good Shepherd holds two Centering Prayer Sessions each week! What is Centering Prayer? Centering Prayer is a receptive method of Christian silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer. The prayer in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. The Wednesday prayer session is held via Zoom at 11 A.M. and consists of an opening reading, 20-minute silent meditation, a spiritual video, and a brief closing discussion. The Youth Group had an Italian cooking lesson from parishioner Lara Bowles.


Looking forward to another year with our amazing middle and high schoolers!

Today, the horses of Tierra Madre serve as healers to hundreds of visitors and volunteers each year through organic interactions on the ground, continuing their mission of promoting a circle of healing between human and horse that has existed for centuries.

Beth Hatcher delivered a check to Native Health Services in Phoenix. Our check helps support urban dwelling Native Americans who pick up food boxes from Native Health once per month. This program is privately funded so the number of food boxes is dependent upon private funds rather than government support.
